### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

#### Dear Parents,

How are you going at home with all the wet weather? Day after day of being inside, cancelled family, sporting and outdoor events. Now imagine life back at school with 20 plus children all feeling frustrated by the weather.

#### Time to learn to relax!

Last week we introduced to the children the "Smiling Minds" Program. It is a free app that you can use at home too. The children are taught mindfulness and relaxation techniques that will impact on their well-being , resilience and concentration. It was recommended to us by the CEDP Behaviour and Well-Being experts as a program that has been proven to be effective. Most classes use the program in the middle of the day, after we pray the Angelus together. Kindergarten and Year 1 also use another program called Go Noodle, which is also an app that parents can get. They use it for fun lesson breaks but it can also be used at home for those stressful times when you are trying to cook dinner. There's even a bedtime component and this app too has some relaxation exercises.

You may have noticed that our gate is being closed more promptly this year. All children need to be at school by 8:30 because this is when learning begins. The weather has played havoc with morning traffic, to avoid the morning rush aim to have the children at school as early as possible. Playground supervision begins at 8:00 and the Kiss and Drop is usually very quiet between 8 and 8:15.

Yesterday we had a beautiful mass to celebrate the Feast Day of St Joseph. For those new to the school we are named after Jesus' father on earth, St Joseph was a hard-working tradie who stood by a vulnerable woman and gave his stepson a loving family to grow safely within. You may know someone who is like St Joseph. He is in many ways a saint for our time.

#### PBS4L (Positive Behaviour Support for Learning)



#### Family Prayers for Lent

One of the real challenges that we too often find in our busy lives is finding time to be together as a family. It is especially difficult to find opportunities to pray together. Here are a few possibilities for praying as a family during Lent or at any other time of the year.

#### Prayer before Meals

Meals are a natural time to pray as a family. We can begin by simply saying, "Let's pray," or "Let's pause for a minute to give thanks." This can be a brief prayer. Brief prayer doesn't have to be without substance or power.

#### Praying at Other Times

*In the Morning:* It can be quite transformative of our family bonds, in faith, to pause very briefly to pray together in the morning. This might be a spontaneous prayer, such as while we are lying in bed. When we are rushing around one another in the kitchen and grabbing breakfast, it can be wonderful to pause to pray and simply ask the Lord to be with each of us in what we are about to do.

Other times: Such as cleaning up or in preparation for guests coming for dinner or for an overnight slumber party. We might share the responsibility for designing the family prayer for special occasions: birthdays, anniversaries, the
