FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Jn 16:12-15

Jesus said to his disciples: "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. He will not speak on him own, but he will speak what he hears, and will declare to you the things that are coming, He will glorify me, because he will take from what is mine and declare it to you. Everything that the Father has is mine; for this reason I told you that he will take from what is mine and declare it to you."

The Spirit of Truth...Will Guide You to All Truth

When we compare the text of the four Gospels with the volumes of Church teachings, the questions arises: How does the Church know all this? Jesus does not teach such truths or dogmas as the Trinity and the "real presence of Christ in the Eucharist."

The Gospel suggests an answer. Jesus is aware that his disciples, most of them simple fishermen, are not able to grasp the fundamental truths about God. He teaches them just the basics. They are only in "Grade 1." As a student learns little by little by being guided into more difficult matters by teachers, so Jesus promises a "theology professor" who will lead his disciples deeper into the mystery of God: the Holy Spirit.

And so, guided by this great Spirit, the Church has been able to explain the truth Jesus had sown like a mustard seed into the soil of the first disciples. Jesus spoke to people in Palestine, what would happen when his teaching would enter the Greek and Roman world? What would happen when it would be proclaimed in totally different cultures- in Asia and in Africa? No problem! For every culture, for every time, this Spirit will be able to teach the truth through the magisterium, the teaching authority of the Church.

Lord, let me always be open to the teachings of the Church. Help me trust that there your Spirit is guiding us safely.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents, Carers and Friends of St Joseph's,

Welcome to Week 2. Last week was a very busy start to Term 2. It started with the St Joseph's students, families and teachers attending the Riverstone Anzac Dawn Service. A very big thanks you to Mrs Bonnici for supporting our school community in attending and organising the students and the Wreath. Thank you to Mrs Neill and Mrs Delvecchio for joining us all at 5.15 am.

A number of staff engaged in professional learning during the week and I am very excited with the greater learning that they will be sharing with our school community.

- Miss Boudib and Mrs Bates attended professional learning on Sensory Processing Disorders (providing a range of learning experiences that can be used across the classroom). They are very keen to share their new learnings with our school community.
- Mr Atkins, Miss Dennett, Mr Parnis, Mrs Delvecchio, Mrs Slater and myself attended the Focus 160 Stage 3 Reading workshops on Thursday and Friday. We all have so many great resources to share. We will be working as a professional Learning Community (PLC) in developing our skills with the aim of sharing new learnings with all staff.

Yesterday, Mr Adams and Mr Parnis accompanied a number of students to the Diocesan Cross Country Event. Our school community was very excited to hear that Isaac Beecroft finished 3rd in his race, and has registered for the CPS Cross Country at Eastern Creek on the 17th June, 2016.. Well done, Isaac!



Curriculum Overviews for each grade will be sent home on Friday with your child. The Curriculum overview provides the content and learning skills your child will be engaging in the Key Learning Areas during Term 2. I encourage you to read through the overview and take note of the topics your child will be studying. The information will give you the opportunity to discuss the topic themes in your family discussions and planned outings. This will assist in building you child's knowledge and understanding about topics giving them the experiences to talk to their peers and teachers during the term.

It is very important for children to engage in 'Purposeful Talk'. Researchers looked at families with young children who were learning to talk, they found that no matter what a family's economic or social situation, the more that parents engaged in daily conversations with their children, the more rapidly the children's vocabularies grew (Hart & Risley, 1999).

Nearly all families talk with their children to get things accomplished, such as eating, getting dressed, and keeping children safe and occupied. The extra conversation, however, done just for the pleasure of a social exchange, makes a real difference. The amount of this extra conversation is highly related to children's vocabulary growth.

The more language that 2- year-olds hear, the more rapidly they add words to their vocabulary. The richer the vocabulary and the more complex the sentences that children hear, the more quickly their language develops beginning at age 2. The helpfulness of speech for explaining a word's magning really makes a difference in children's language.

Model Good Conversation Skills

- Choose a topic that is important to the child.
- Ask a thought-provoking question or make an open-ended comment to prompt the child's response.
- Wait at least 3 seconds (longer for children for whom English is a second language), to give the child a chance to think and respond.
- Listen to the child and respond with more conversation.

The more different types of words that adults use with young children, the larger vocabularies preschoolers develop.

In summary, talking more, helping children understand the meanings of words, and speaking in richer, more complex ways leads to more rapid growth in children's language. Source.. http://southernearlychildhood.org/upload/pdf/Talking With Young Children.pdf

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FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Next week, the Year 3 and Year 5 students will be participating in the 2016 NAPLAN testing. On behalf of the St Joseph's School Community I wish them every success. NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy. It is important to remember that NAPLAN tests are not pass/fail tests. At the class-room level it is one of a number of important tools used by teachers to measure student progress.

NAPLAN tests are constructed to give students an opportunity to demonstrate skills they have learned over time through the school curriculum, and NAPLAN test days should be treated as just another routine event on the school calendar. The best way you can help your child prepare for NAPLAN is to reassure them that NAPLAN tests are just one part of their school program, and to urge them to simply do the best they can on the day.

FORMATION

On Monday 2nd May, the teachers engaged in a day of deepening their understanding of planning and preparing effective lessons on teaching Scripture in Religious Education. The teachers began the day by looking at how to take the children from a literal understanding of scripture to a deeper understanding of it and its key message and what this means for us in our daily life. We also looked at making links with the scripture to God, Jesus, Church and the Sacraments. The teachers then looked at writing effective Learning Intentions and Success Criteria for their program and creating interactive Word Walls on key words in the Scripture.

LITERACY

The teachers are currently working collaboratively in further developing their understanding on the key components of the literacy block which are , Daily Shared Reading , Guided Reading or Reading groups for students off levelled readers, Daily Reading Aloud to Students, Daily Independent Reading, Daily Modelled Writing or Shared Writing, Guided writing, Purposeful Talk and Daily Independent Writing. As part of this they are investigating effective teaching strategies to meet the various needs of the students in our school.

- 1. Open the module by clicking the Start link
- 2. Read through the presentation
- 3. Complete and submit quiz questions this will take approximately 45 minutes
- 4. After successful completion of the module, fill out the form by typing name, email address. contact number, contact address and the school.
- 5. A notification of successful completion of the module will be sent via e-mail to the school and also to the volunteer's email address.

If you would like to assist in the classrooms, at carnivals and our excursions you will need to complete this training module online. If you completed the online Child Protection Training Session in 2014 you will need to redo the training module as your training is only valid until 2016.
