FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Sunday Gospel for 20 September, 2015

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark 9:31-35

Jesus was teaching his disciples and telling them, "The Son of Man is to be handed over to men and they will kill him, and three days after his death he will rise." But they did not understand the saying, and they were afraid to question him. They came to Capernaum and, once inside the house, he began to ask them, What were you arguing about on the way?" But they remained silent. They had been discussing among themselves on the way who was the greatest. Then he sat down, called the Twelve, and said to them, " If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of us all."

Reflection

There is something very important about the "house" in Mark's Gospel. Jesus imparts important lessons along the journey, but the house is the more intimate setting where he levels with the Twelve. Along the way, they hear Jesus talking about his demise and launch into a battle over who will be the greatest among them. In the house, Jesus tells them the greatest is the one who serves. Look at your household. What does it mean to be the greatest? Is it the one who controls the purse, or the one who prepares the meals, or the one who goes to school? How do you measure importance within your house? According to Jesus, it must be through selfless service.


MATHEMATICS NEWS

Mathematics News from Year 3


During our Mathematics warm ups Year Three have been array busting with different numbers to explore multiplication. Then we have explained different strategies that we have used. We used language such as; times, multiplied by, groups of, rows of and repeated addition.

We have used the app Popplet on our iPads and the camera to show different ways we can make arrays using counters to prove our thinking.

In our tribe groups we have explored what a metre squared is and how big it is by making a metre square out of newspaper. We then measured different areas in our classroom and the playground with it.
