The legend told in this document says that after years of childlessness, an angel appeared to tell Anne and Joachim that they would have a child. Anne promised to dedicate this child to God. Whatever their names or the facts of their lives, we can assume that Mary was raised in a Jewish family home faithful to God and to the religious traditions of her day such that she was led to respond wholeheartedly to God's request with faith, "Let it be done to me as you will."

SUPERVISION and DUTY OF CARE

At St Joseph's all staff members are aware of their Duty of Care responsibilities and exercise these each day whilst the students are in their care. As a staff we have been working with teachers to ensure they have a clear understanding of their Duty of Care responsibilities. We ask that parents support us in this.

Supervision of students commences at 8am when a teacher rostered to do morning playground supervision opens the school gate. Adequate supervision of students is provided at this time. Direct supervision of students that arrive before 8am is not provided and they are to sit and wait at the school playground gate entrance area until the duty teacher arrives.

It is recommended that parents do not drop off their students at school before 8am. Before School care is available as an alternative. If students are dropped off before 8am, we may need to contact you to discuss the safety of your children.

We also ask that when parents are collecting their children after school, that they supervise their children to ensure that they are safe at all times.

Attendance

School attendance is not only mandatory, it is vital to student learning. Students who are absent from school, whether it is a full day or part of the day, may be disadvantaged in their learning progress and ongoing development. At St Josephs we will be monitoring school attendance each week. Please ensure that you send in a note explaining your child's absence any time they are away. Failure to do so after 7 days means that your child will be marked absent without reason. The teacher, Assistant Principal or Principal may contact you if we are concerned with your child's attendance at school.

If you require longer leave, please follow the following guidelines.

1-9 days absence: Parents must notify the school principal by mail or email (in written form).

10-99 days absence: Parents must complete and submit the Application for Extended Leave form prior to commencing leave OR apply for extended leave in writing to the principal directly. If approved, the Principal issues a Certificate of Extended Leave. If the principal declines this application (i.e it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined would be forthcoming from the school. The certificates are attached to the letter of extended leave or application form.

Our grandparents are special no matter where they live, whether we see them often or only every now and again. Our grandparents can teach us many things and share some great memories from when they grew up.





BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES – NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS AND CONTRAC-TORS

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that all volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are volunteering.

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are contracting.
