NAPLAN 2019

If your child is in Year 3 or Year 5, they are required to sit the NAPLAN (National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy) test. NAPLAN tests skills in literacy and numeracy that are developed over time through the school curriculum.

This year the NAPLAN test will be done online except for writing in Year 3. The assessment window for NAPLAN Online is extended from three days provided for the paper test to nine days. This is to give schools more flexibility in scheduling and accommodate schools that may have fewer devices. The NAPLAN Online assessment window starts on Tuesday 14 May and finishes on Friday 24 May 2019.

The Schedule is as follows

ATTENDANCE

She is there to support all parents ensuring that your child is at school so that Every Day Counts for them.

If your child is away, it is important that this is communicated to your child's classroom teacher. This can be done with a note explaining their absence within 7 days or a phone call to the office. If you have not sent in a note explaining your child's absence, then you will receive a reminder letter. If you have sent in a note explaining your child's absence, please disregard this letter. If you wish to take extended leave of more than 5 days, please complete the appropriate form, available on the school website, as this leave needs to be approved by the principal.





K-6 Curricular Mandarin Chinese Program

St Joseph's Primary Schofields is excited to introduce weekly Mandarin Chinese classes across K-6 as part of its curriculum from 2019 Term 1. Students will learn practical Mandarin and Chinese culture and develop an appreciation for multi-cultural diversity.

Why learn Mandarin Chinese:

- Mandarin Chinese is the world's most spoken language with 1 in every 5 people in the world speaking it. It is also the most spoken language after English in Australia.
- China is the world's second largest economy and Australia's largest trading partner.
- Learning Chinese enhances cognitive capabilities as the unique tonal and pictorial language uses both sides of the brain, whereas most other languages including English only use the left side of the brain!

How students learn the Chinese language and culture in class:

- Multi-sensory and multimedia learning through interactive games, stories, songs, crafts, and fun activities both online and offline.
- Cultural enrichment through authentic Chinese festival celebrations.
- Visual and auditory associative memorisation techniques for effective learning of word pronunciation and character recognition.

How to extend learning outside of the classroom:

- Enjoy first-hand experience of Chinese culture by going to Chinese restaurants and trying yum cha and hot pot etc; sample authentic Chinese tea at the Zensation teahouse; visit oriental places of interest such as the Chinese Garden of Friendship and the White Rabbit Gallery (contemporary Chinese art); celebrate Chinese New Year and other major Chinese festivals.
- Download Chinese educational game apps to your tablet / phone and learn some words and phrases together. Share these new words at your next Mandarin class.
- Use Google Translate to find out how to say something and double check with your Mandarin Teacher its correct pronunciation and usage.
- Practise words and phrases you learn in class with your Chinese friends / neighbours or even a friendly Chinese waiter / shopkeeper in Chinatown.
- Take a family trip to China or to another Mandarin-speaking country such as Singapore, Taiwan, and part of Malaysia and Thailand etc. Experience the wonders and richness of Chinese history, architecture and culture.
