FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents, Carers and Friends of St Joseph's,

Welcome to Week 8, this time of the year is very busy for schools. The teachers are finalising report writing and preparing for the Parent Teacher Interviews.

Parent-teacher interviews are a great way to find out how your child is going and show your interest in your child's learning and school life. These interviews are short meetings – about 15 minutes – between you and your child's teacher.

Parent-teacher interviews give you a great opportunity to:

learn more about your child's academic, emotional and social development meet and get to know your child's teachers help your child's teacher understand more about your child make plans with the teacher about how you can both support your child build a relationship with your child's school.

If you don't have any particular concerns, you might wonder whether it's worth going to parent-teacher interviews. But going along is one way to show your child that you're interested in his/her learning needs and what's happening for him/her at school.

Of course, it you do have concerns, it's a chance for you to raise them with your child's teacher if you haven't done that already. If you require more time, other than the 15 minutes, I suggest you make another appointment, convenient to you and the teacher.


An evening has been allocated for working parents. It is Wednesday 22nd June from 2.45 pm with the last interview being 7.15 pm to support parents to meet with their child's teacher. Each teacher has also offered alternate times throughout the week for parents to book an appointment interview.

On behalf of the teachers, I request that you honour the 15 minute timeframe for the meeting, as the parent-teacher meeting schedule is tight and doesn't allow for the meetings to run over time. Your child's learning is important so I suggest again making another time for a longer meeting if desired.

Today the Semester 1 Reports will be coming home with your child. Parents and carers have been advised of the booking details for Teacher/ Parent Interviews earlier this term. If you haven't already booked your interview time please follow the directions.

PBS4L

Consequences Flow Chart

As part of the PBS4L project, as a staff we have developed a consequences flow chart when students are not demonstrating our rules of being a Learner, Safe and Respectful. This is a flow chart that details the steps that teachers follow in managing student minor and major behaviours. As a staff we have identified what constitutes minor and major behaviours and have defined them and given examples. This is attached in the newsletter.

When it is a minor behaviour, students are given opportunities to change their behaviour before going to the reflection space to reflect on their behaviour. Once students get to this point an incident report is completed and the students complete a reflection sheet which will go home for you to discuss with your child, sign and return. The teacher will contact you to inform you of the situation and to let you know that a reflection sheet is coming home. If the student continues the behaviour they are then referred to the coordinator which will then contact you. If it is a major behaviour then the coordinator, Assistant Principal, or Principal are involved immediately and you will be notified. If you have any questions about the consequences flow chart please see your grade's coordinator.

Counsellor

At St Joseph's we have a school counsellor, Laura Rowell. She is at our school every Thursday. Laura plays a pivotal role in supporting many of the students and families in our school community. Students are referred to the school counsellor through the principal after consultation with the parents and teachers.

Professional Learning

Last week at our Professional Learning Meeting, the teachers all presented information about the different instructional practices of the literacy block. Each day the students engage in the following instructional practices during literacy; Shared Reading, Guided Reading, Independent Reading, Read Alouds, Modelled/Shared Writing, Guided Writing and Independent Writing. The teachers outlined their purpose and effective teaching strategies for each of these. The presentations were creative and informative, deepening our understanding of these instructional practices.



NEED TO KNOW

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES – NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS AND CONTRACTORS

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that all volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

Volunteers – please click on 'Building Child Safe Communities – Undertaking for Volunteers' or access the form via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au, then click on 'Child Protection Training Forms' (halfway down page on the right hand side).



Then click on 'Volunteer Form' (halfway down page).

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are volunteering.

Contractors – please click on 'Building Child Safe Communities – Undertaking for Contractors or access the form via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au, then click on 'Child Protection Training Forms' (halfway down page on the right hand side).



Then click on 'Contractor Form' (bottom of page).

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are contracting.

For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor If any of the details you have provided on the form change

1. Redirect Behaviour



Second warning – Reinforce rule -Respectful, Safe, Learner



Stating what the appropriate behaviour is and what you want them to do



3. Third Warning - Student sent to Reflection Space to complete reflection sheet and teacher writes an incident report. If on the playground student completes reflection sheet in the office. The teacher contacts the parents regarding the incident.



Student sit in reflection time for 2-3 minutes (5min Max). Teacher to record on tally document.



Reflection sheet sent home for parent to sign and returned back to school. Copies of the reflection sheet are made – one copy for the teacher to be attached to the interview book after phone call and one for the office.



If the student continues, they are sent to the Coordinators Classroom with the reflection sheet completed in the step before.

Coordinator discusses it with the student to reteach behaviour.

The coordinator is to CONTACT PARENTS and let them know of the incident.

If a child repeatedly gets to third warning, it is recommended that this is viewed as a behaviour problem in the classroom and parents need to be contacted by the teacher to ensure that the rules are followed and student learning is not disrupted.

Re-entry into class – should be welcoming and giving the child opportunities to demonstrate good behaviours and reinforce and identify good behaviours that the child is showing.

Timing – every day is a new day – bearing in mind teachers are looking for patterns in behaviour

Use lanyards as a way to show warnings.

Consequence Flow Chart - Major Behaviours

Teacher refers the incident to the coordinator/AP/Principal- either by phone if in the classroom or messenger if on the playground.



Coordinator talks to the child – reinforcing the correct behaviour and rule and contacts the parents to let them know of the incident - consequence given.



Depending on the degree of the major incident - A Parent meeting is made to re – enter the child to school.

Teacher that witnessed incident completes incident report.

If Physical Aggression where student/teacher or parent has been physically hurt
Principal/AP are advised ASAP.



Incident logged onto the assault register and Parent Meeting is made immediately
