FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Sunday Gospel for 9 August, 2015

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 6:44-51

[Jesus said to the crowds:] "No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draw him, and I will raise him on the last day. It is written in the prophets: *They shall be taught by God*. Everyone who listens to my Father and learns from him comes to me. Not that anyone has seen the Father except the one who is from God; he has seen the Father. Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate the manna in the desert but they died; this is the bread that comes from heaven so that one may eat it and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

Reflection

Jesus declares that the bread that he gives is his flesh "for the life of the world." At the Eucharist, do we see ourselves participating in an action that is meant to ripple outward for the world's salvation? The components of the Eucharist are meant to form in us a pattern that brings life far beyond the church doors. We practice the art of "gathering," of "listening" to the Word, of "sacrificing" all that we are, to draw closer to one another in "communion". As you participate in the Eucharist, imagine yourself lifting the world up to the Father in Christ for its healing, bringing all people together in life.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Carers of St Joseph's,

From the beginning of Term 3 our school community has been celebrating significant events where everyone has joined together to ensure St Joseph's is a welcoming and celebrating community. The following quotes are inspirational thinking....

Our school motto 'Together We Can' expresses the desire to belong to a community of faith with God and each other we can do great things. I know how important it is to me to be part of a school community where everyone is working together to make a difference in the lives of others, especially our students, parents and staff.

This term we have extended our love and hospitality to our grandparents. The Grandparent's Liturgy and Morning Tea was well attended by so many grandparents and parents. There were quite a few grandparents who travelled a far distance to be part of the St Joseph's celebrations and open classroom visit.

The Role of Grandparents

According to Arthur Kornhaber, M.D., president and founder of the Foundation for Grandparenting and the nation's foremost expert on grandparenting issues, there are 11 roles grandparents play in a family. Grandparents offer children a broader range of knowledge, emotions and experience than they did as parents. They also inhabit a special place in the family as a trusted adult, yet separate and different from the child's parents, and may provide a safe place for children to turn in times of stress when they feel they cannot approach their parents. The following are the special roles grandparents can play in the lives of their grandchildren.

- Ancestor:** You are the head of the family unit and a connection to the family's common history.
- Buddy:** Dr. Korhhaber's studies have shown that many grandparents "treat their grandchildren in a more relaxed and permissive manner than they ever treated their own children.
- Hero:** Being a hero gives your grandchild someone to model his or her life after and someone to inspire them.
- Historian:** The role of historian overlaps somewhat with Ancestor; however, you are the living witness to the history of your own time, in addition to that of your ancestors. This gives the child a sense of "we," solidifying the fact that he or she belongs to a family unit – something bigger than themselves - and gives him or her a sense of safety and security.
- Mentor:** This goes beyond just teaching your child a subject - you are a cheerleader inspiring her imagination and her dreams, nurturing her spirit, and encouraging her intellectual growth while giving her a sense of self-worth.
- Nurturer:** Your role of nurturer as a grandparent is similar to your role as parent, with some added functions and advantages. Your support provides an emotional and social safety net for the entire family, making your grandchildren feel safe and secure.
- Role Model:** Your actions can teach your grandchildren how they should behave in society, care for themselves, and how they should aspire to be as future parents and grandparents themselves.
- Spiritual Guide:** Your role as a spiritual guide to your grandchildren can help teach them to value and achieve spiritual rewards such as love, tolerance, compassion, reverence, joy, peace, gentleness, faith and kindness.
- Student:** While it's true you have many valuable things to teach your grandchild, don't forget that you have many valuable lessons to learn about and from them.
- Teacher:** You have a fantastic opportunity to impart your knowledge, special skills, and experience to your grandchildren as their teacher
- Wizard:** Your role as a wizard provides your grandchild with a playful, imaginative alternative to their task-oriented daily life. You can indulge your grandchild's fantasies because you don't have to worry about the daily discipline.

It was wonderful to experience community again at the *St Joseph's Family Mass* at the Mary Immaculate Parish Mass on Sunday 26th July. Many students, parents and staff celebrated mass with Fr Reggie. Our students participated in the Mass during the Liturgy of the Word, Procession of the Gifts and Prayers of the Faithful. 



Census Day

School Banking Account Opening Day

St Josephs Primary is excited to offer the Commonwealth Bank School Banking program to all students.

The School Banking program provides children with an opportunity to make deposits into their personal Commonwealth Bank Youthsaver account at school each week. The program is about how often your child makes deposits, not how much they deposit.

To encourage regular savings behaviour the program offers an exciting Rewards Program. Every deposit earns your child a Dollarmites token, and once they've collected 10 tokens they can redeem them for a reward.

School Banking day is WEDNESDAY. Each week you need to take their bank book to the School Banking coordinators in the playground before the bell.

The Commonwealth Bank will be holding an account opening day from 8am to 9am on Wednesday 12th August 2015. If you are interested in opening a Commonwealth Bank Youthsaver account for your child please bring along your current driver's licence or another form of photographic identification. No identification is required for your child attending school, as the school will confirm their identity. Alternatively, you can open an account at any branch, by calling 13 22 21, or online if you are an existing Commonwealth Bank customer.

Religious Literacy Assessment for Year 4 and Year 6 Students

All Year 4 and Year 6 students will participate in a Diocesan Assessment of their religious literacy over the next three weeks.

During Week 6, students in these grades will complete an online assessment. The students will answer a series of multiple choice questions related to their learning in Religious Education.

In addition, throughout Week 5, Year 4 students only will complete a variety of learning tasks related to the Religious Education unit, Reconciliation: God's Forgiveness and Healing. Their achievement in completing these tasks will be formally assessed. A report based on students' completion of these assessments will be forwarded to the Year 4 parents during Term 4.

PBS4L Update

PBS4L is a whole school framework that helps us create positive learning environments for all students at St. Joseph's.

The PBS4L framework is a research based and proactive school wide system that establishes clear behaviour expectations. The process involves explicitly teaching and reteaching students how to enact positive behaviours.

Our aim is to produce positive outcomes for both students and teachers by creating positive learning environments that makes St. Joseph's an even better place to learn. PBS4L encourages consistency amongst teachers in our approach to behaviour management both in acknowledging and reinforcing positive behaviours.

PBS4L simply is about learning to be all of these things...

- To be safe
- To be respectful
- To be a learner.

Home Links

At St. Joseph's we believe that families play an essential role in their children's social and educational development and learning. The use of consistent language at home and school is a fantastic strategy to reinforce positive behaviour.

Below are some questions that can be used for discussion at home:

- How can I be positive and helpful at home?
- What words do I use to show respect?
- How do I show respect to Mum, Dad, brothers and Sisters?
- What responsibilities do I have at home?
- How can I be Safe at home?
- What areas at home are unsafe to play in?
- What is something I am working towards?
- How did I show my personal best today?

Mini Maths Teams

Staff at St Joseph's believe that to **make a big difference to the students learning** in Mathematics, they constantly need to be learning to refine their own practice. During this term the teachers committed to support a project that focused on the **teacher learning** for teachers in Kindergarten, Year 1 and Stage 3.

This project involved the teachers working in small teams with Mrs Farhat (Numeracy Lead Teacher) working with Kindergarten, Mrs Watson (EMU Specialist Teacher) working with Year 1 and myself (Numeracy Lead Teacher and Leader of Learning) working with Stage 3.

For the first three weeks of this term, the teams have worked together, setting goals and working towards achieving them in the learning spaces. Last Wednesday also involved a visit to Holy Cross, Glenwood to visit a Kindergarten room. During the term our teams will continue on Thursdays as the teachers look to embed the changes in the classroom. This fits within our school's Implementation Plan.

Two of our teacher's have kindly shared their reflections thus far:

In Stage 3 the Mini Maths Teams during this term has provided an excellent opportunity to refine skills working in a teaching partnership to deliver a quality Maths block. Our warm ups are a chance to develop the number skills of the students at their point of need. The investigations create an environment that promote hard thinking with the teachers asking questions and prompts throughout that extend and enable our students. This professional learning opportunity is an invaluable experience.

This term, we have been team teaching with Mrs Farhat in Maths. We have refined our Maths block, learnt new warm-ups that encourage Mathematical thinking and language and we have further analysed student data around counting, which will direct our differentiated teaching for each student. We also had the privilege of visiting Holy Cross Glenwood, which give us an insight into another Kindy classroom and tasks that we have begun using and will continue to use in our classrooms.


Book Week at St. Joseph's
