### Coding and Chess 2018

These are extra curricular activities for children that provide them with an opportunity to learn new skills beyond the classroom.

In an ever increasing digital world, coding workshops provide opportunities for students to learn and develop skills of the future. In Term 1, the students will be focusing on "Minecraft Modding Mayhem". Please find the letters attached for further details.

Learning and playing chess helps children develop their logical thinking and problem solving skills, improves their concentration and focus, while also being a great source of enjoyment. #### **AWARDS**

Each year we present our students with class and whole school awards. Two students from each class are selected to receive one of the following awards: Student Excellence Award and Mary MacKillop Award. At a whole school level, teachers nominate one student from their grade that they believe meets the criteria for the St Joseph's Award. The leadership team then meets to decide which student across the whole school will receive this award. These awards will be presented to the students on Friday 15thDecember after the End of Year Mass.

Below are details of the award selection criteria that teachers use when selecting their students to receive these awards.

#### STUDENT EXCELLENCE AWARD

Criteria for Student Excellence Awards - Each teacher nominates ONE student per class

who meets at least 3 of the criteria

An "Excellent Student" is someone who has demonstrated:

- Consistent effort and achievement in any one or more areas of learning;
- Effective study habits/organization and responsibility for their own learning;
- Inclusiveness of all class members and helped others in their learning;
- Awareness of social justice by standing up for or by those excluded;
- Interest in the whole school not just themselves or their friendship groups;
- A significant positive contribution to the classroom atmosphere;
- Sensitivity to the needs of others and actively promoted harmonious relationships;
- · Consistent courtesy and good manners to all;
- Initiative with ideas and activities that contribute to the life of the school.

### MARY MACKILLOP AWARD

Criteria for Mary MacKillop Award:

Each teacher nominates ONE student to receive a Mary MacKillop Award .This is the student from your class who regularly demonstrates the following

"Never see a need without doing something about it"

### ST JOSEPH'S AWARD

Criteria selection:

This Shield will be given to ONE student in the whole school who regularly demonstrates the following which also reflects the person that St Joseph was.

A student who - Acts justly, loves tenderly and walks humbly with God (Micah 6:8)

#### **School Fees**

2018 School - Based Fees

Due to our school progressing from one finance system to a new system in 2018 there will be some new terminology used regarding our school – based fees.

Next year the school- based fees will be amalgamated into categories rather than individual amounts and will be equally divided into 3 instalments during the year.

For example:

Please also note that we will no longer refer to the Statement Fees as Term 1, Term 2 and Term 3, but they will be referred to as Billing Periods.

Next week at our Monday morning assembly, the students, teachers and parents will gather together to celebrate the Second Sunday of Advent.


Please join us as we gather together as a school community to prayer during this special time.




