Principal's Message

Dear Parents,

This week is Catholic Schools Week that celebrates the special nature of Catholic education. Catholic education in Australia began in Parramatta 200 years ago. The first school was in Hunter Street, Parramatta, close to the dwellings of the poor Irish convicts. At that time all children were not guaranteed an education, certainly not poor children or girls. The school had 31 students and a lay teacher who was an ex-convict with some protestant pupils. The idea was that the education was for all.

We continue with this inclusive mission today. The teachers and I were very pleased to welcome so many visitors yesterday to our liturgy and open classrooms and also to 1G and IBF's assembly. I understand the effort that you take to organise your family and work to attend and I hope you felt welcomed. I enjoyed the chance to chat with the visitors about the education that they observed in action. Most classes were continuing their regular day. Reading groups were taught with the teacher actively leading a small group of students with precision. Maths tasks were designed that stretched the children's thinking that meant the children were engaged with this challenge; ratio and fractions being used at a high level requiring algebraic thinking. Many games were being played to make learning fun. Ipads were used by the students to clarify the task set by the teacher and as a tool to help with the learning. Some older students were asked to share their learning on seesaw which meant that parents who were not able to be there could see the learning happening. Year 5 had on display a new addition to the school- a 3D printer that they are using in their mathematical learning and, also for their geography unit. Adjustments we make for the children with disabilities were also on display. Parents who visited would have seen extra teachers and teacher assistants working in the classroom with the regular teachers so that the learning for the students can be targeted at the right level for all students in a way that is natural and inclusive and cares for the dignity of the children.

Assembly is a chance for us to highlight the values of our education. Children are coached and expected to listen respectfully. It's a chance for the children's writing, music and drama to have an audience. Most especially our learning and Gospel values are highlighted. There are a lot of awards! That's because we have lots of beautiful children who strive every day to be kind, try hard and work hard.

Premier's Reading Challenge

- St. Joseph's School students will be taking part in the Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) for 2020. It runs from 2nd March to 28th August 2020.
- Reading log sheets will be given to students next week, with passwords to the PRC website following soon after.
- Books read after last year's Challenge can be counted in this year's Challenge.
- K-2 students can read books on their own, read them with someone, or someone can read the book to them.
- Students in Years 3-6 must read the books themselves, but may have someone help choose the books.
- You must read a certain amount of books as prescribed in the table below

Challenge	Number of books you must read	Minimum number of PRC books	Maximum number of Personal Choice books	PRC booklists you can read from
K-2	30	25	5	K-2, 3-4, 5-6
3-4, 5-6	20	15	5	3-4, 5-6

It is a wonderful challenge to participate in as reading broadens our horizons in many ways, increases vocabulary, helps in writing, is calming and expands empathy.
