A Place for all in the Playground

Just before I wrote this front page, I was lucky enough to join Year 1 having a picnic in the place where the Year 3 demountables once stood. We sat on the mats and the seats under the trees, chased some bubbles, played with the frisbees, and “cooked” in the outdoor play kitchens. Yesterday, Year 3 had a turn and last week Year 4 and Year 2 did. Other grades will have a turn soon.



One of the great things about our new school is the number of different places to play. The picnic area is calming and sensory. Area 3, the big grass area behind the school, is great for ball games. Every day we put out a big treasure chest filled with board games like chess, card games, and Connect 4 that the children play on the stadium seats. We use the big televisions for dancing games. COVID Update

Thank you for your continued efforts to help us and you family remain COVID free. As outlined in the recent letter we now have a CEDP and State School directive, the expectation that:

- all children with cold and flu symptoms need to be tested and not return to school until they have a clear test communicated with the school and, also, no further symptoms;
- we have cancelled all assemblies;
- no parents are to be on site. Social distancing for the park and walk pickup will continue. Your patience is greatly appreciated with rolling pickup. Remember not to arrive too early to avoid long queues;

- we have no singing or chanting.

This morning's news about school closures

We woke up this morning with the news that, out of caution, Wyndham College at Quakers Hill, Riverstone High and Schofields Public School have been closed for today so they can be thoroughly cleaned. A parent with children at these schools has tested positive as has one of the older children.

St John Paul II College senior- Years 11 and 12 have some minimal interaction with Wyndham College. Any shared areas with Wyndham College will be deep cleaned today. This is a separate campus to the school behind our school. As a precaution JP II are taking extra care with cleaning, however, they have taken advice that it will be safe to open today.

You may recall that we stopped children from JP II entering our school grounds and any big brothers or sisters picking up siblings from our school must be socially distanced and wait in the queue outside our gate.

The situation will continue to be monitored, with the assistance of NSW Health and, of course, we are taking care with our cleaning, social distancing, hand washing and sanitising.

Building Work

After a blissful 6 weeks with no building construction, our third and final building has commenced this week. We have delivery of site sheds and ground preparation happening at the moment.

Scheduled finish time for the building is Term 3 2021.
