Dear Parents,

Those of you who use rolling pickup in the afternoon would have noticed the new building foundations are well underway. The picture below shows what the new building will look like from Nazarene Crescent. The proposed, wide, entrance to Nazarene Crescent is shown. You can also glimpse the bike rack, which is in front of the new canteen, and some outdoor leaning areas. The roof to the very left of the picture is our current library which will remain the same after the building is finished. The builders are saying that it will be completed by the end of Term 3 next year.



Part of the building work is the demolition of the toilet block adjacent to the carpark at the front of the school. This will happen in about 2 weeks' time. It will mean some minor changes to the entrance to and exit from the school from Alex Avenue so that the carpark will be expanded, landscaped and ready for the new school year.




Operation Christmas Child
