
There's information about NAPLAN for students in Years 3 and 5. Mrs Delvecchio has put information about attendance, reminding of the importance of arriving at school on time.

PBS4L (POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT FOR LEARNING) AT ST JOSEPH'S

I AM SAFE, I AM RESPECTFUL and I AM A LEARNER is our Joey Code at St Joseph's. This is part of our Positive Behaviour Support for Learning (PBS4L), a framework we use to create a safe, consistent and positive learning environment for students, staff and parents.

Students can earn Joey tickets anywhere in the school by any staff member when they are seen to be demonstrating the Joey Code. Our main focus is reinforcing and rewarding positive behaviours.

Once students have collected 10 Joeys, they get a stamp on their Joey Card. There are three levels of Joey Cards and Awards – Bronze, Silver and Gold. 10 Stamps for a Bronze award, 15 stamps for a Silver Award and 20 Stamps for a gold Award.

AWARDS

Each week the students in the school are given awards. Normally we would do this at assembly but the teachers have been giving them to the students as a grade. As of next term, when assemblies start again, these awards will be handed out then. We have different awards that we give out each week. If your child is receiving an award, your child's teacher will notify you via Seesaw.

Gospel Value Award - this award is given to a student that demonstrates the Gospel Value that we are focussing on. This term the Gospel Value is **Aspire not to have more but to BE more**.

Leap to Learn Award - this award is given to a student who demonstrates the following qualities when doing their work - Having a Go, Hard Thinking, Effort, Perseverance and Explaining their Thinking

Joey Award - There are three levels of the Joey Award - Bronze, Silver and Gold. Students earn these awards over time as they earn Joey Tokens as mentioned above.

ATTENDANCE

REMEMBER - EVERY DAY COUNTS

Please ensure that your child not only attends school each day but that they arrive at school on time. Arriving at school on time is just as important as being at school. **Every minute at school counts.** When your child is late to school they miss valuable start of the day procedures and learning that sets them up for a successful day.



If your child is away, please ensure that you write a letter to the teacher explaining why your child was absent or provide a medical certificate if appropriate. Please keep your child at home if they have flu symptoms and get them COVID tested. Results must be sent to the school before your child can return.

NAPLAN

If your child is in Year 3 or Year 5, they are required to sit the NAPLAN (National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy) test. NAPLAN tests skills in literacy and numeracy that are developed over time through the school curriculum.

The NAPLAN test will be done online. The NAPLAN Online assessment window starts on Tuesday, 11th May and finishes on Friday, 21st May 2021. There are opportunities for make-up times should your child not attend on the scheduled day due to unforeseen circumstances.

In Week 9 this term, the students will be given an opportunity to practice taking the NAPLAN test online. This is just a practice and results of this practice are not recorded or accessed.

First Eucharist Sacramental Program 2021 at Mary Immaculate Parish Quakers Hill

Our parish First Eucharist program is for students in year 4 and above, who have already received the sacrament of First Reconciliation.

Each candidate must attend all preparation sessions at the church and **submit** the required materials provided by the sacramental team, to be eligible to receive their First Eucharist.

Registration Details

5th March 2021 Online Registration opens 19th April 2021 Online Registration closes

To register - you will need to register by filling out the registration form online (here is the link) to the Parish Website, go to the Sacraments section) and send it back along with a copy of the child's Baptism Certificate if the child was not baptised in our parish.

Preparation Sessions

There will be three or four preparation sessions for this sacrament which will be done in the church on the dates below.

Monday Classes will begin at 4.00pm or 7pm and run for 1 hour. Tuesday Classes will begin at 4.00pm or 7pm and run for 1 hour.

Monday 26th April or Tuesday 27th April First Class - In the Church Monday 3rd May or Tuesday 4th May Second Class- In the Church Monday 17th May or Tuesday 18th May Third Class- In the Church Monday 24th May or Tuesday 25th May Fourth Class- In the Church





This is not a competition, but a challenge. Listed below is an outline of the challenge rules for various age groups;

PRC Reading Log sheets have been distributed to students for them to list the books they have read, which will later be put on the PRC website when the students have their passwords.
