## Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

What a year we have had! Only 6 weeks of live learning this term but a lot packed into that time. Yesterday was a big day for the school with the graduation mass for Year 6 students. It was a beautiful and solemn occasion. The children wrote letters to their parents on their reflection day earlier in the term. What a touching moment when the children presented their letters! As part of the end of year the students prepared a Year Book where they wrote about their favourite memories of Primary school, their hopes for the future and their advice to their "kindergarten selves". I was very impressed to read that for many their favourite memories were when they were caring for others, their friends of course, but also the younger members of the school. Children new to the school wrote about how they were welcomed. Year 6 wrote about the fun they had at school on excursions and in class, community events such as the Colour Run and discos. Sport was another feature of their responses. Many kids spoke about their appreciation of the new buildings and their teachers.



What was even more impressive was the values they wrote about when giving advice to their kindergarten selves. It was such wise advice; to be kind, be confident, have fun - enjoy every moment, keep small worries small, ask for help, be safe, be true to yourself, learn from mistakes, never give up. Sometimes in the middle of a pandemic, you wonder as a parent and as a school if we have been able to guide the children well. The answers given in the Year 6 2021 Yearbook show that we have been able to and have nurtured some strong resilience that will support the children well as they continue on their life's journey.

As well as farewelling our Year 6 we are farewelling other families who are moving on to new schools. We are also losing two valued members of staff, **Miss Dennett** and **Mrs Keith**. Both are moving to schools closer to their home. I thank both these teachers for all their hard work, dedication and kindness.

## School Fees


Thank you to the families who have finalised their 2021 school fees for the year.

Should your child not be returning to St Joseph's in 2022, could you please contact the office.



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
