Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

Last Wednesday evening, our Zoom Parents and Friends Meeting had over 40 parents attend. It's a great way to learn about what's happening at school and how we can assist the school with fundraising and community events. It's also a great way to hear your questions so that we can make sure you have the information you need to work together with the school.

At the meeting, I spoke about the process of writing reports. Report writing and assigning grades are quite a process. Over the course of the year the teachers assess the children in a variety of ways, not usually via a test but more commonly through an assignment or by looking at work that displays the child's thinking and achievement. The teachers make sure their grades align with the other teachers that teach the same Year level. Teachers on the same year work together closely. Finally, a report is prepared, and this is checked by the co-ordinator of the grade, then by me before it is issued to the parents. Our reports for Kindergarten always look a little different to the reports for the rest of the school as it is the first year of school.

This semester we have returned to full reports that report on all the Key learning Areas of English, Mathematics, PDHPE (sport and health), HSIE (History and geography) and Science. Catholic schools also report on Religious Education and this will give you an idea of what the children have been learning in this learning area. The children are graded on a 5-point scale and the middle grade is where the children are expected to achieve at this time of the year. Previously we have used a letter scale from A-E but we are now using a descriptive phrase as this makes the reports easier to understand.

We also grade the children on their effort. Effort is such an important element of education. Your child/ren will need to and try hard and persevere throughout their life in order to be successful. This year our reports will be published to parents in a new way through the parent portal of Compass. More information about the parent portal is contained within this Newsletter. We are still in the Church's joyful season of Easter. I know your children will be giving you much joy.

Important Information





An important and exciting event coming up in Term 3.


On Thursday 21st July, our official opening and blessing will take place.

ATTENDANCE - EVERY DAY and MOMENT OF LEARNING COUNTS

Please ensure that your child not only attends school each day but that they arrive at school on time. Arriving at school on time is just as important as being at school. Every minute at school counts. When your child is late to school, they miss valuable start of the day procedures and learning that sets them up for a successful day. Remember school starts at 8.30am. If your child arrives after 8.30am, you will need to park on the street and walk your child to the office as there will be no teacher to assist at the Kiss and Drop area or Nazarene Crescent.

If your child is away, please ensure that you write a letter to the teacher explaining why your child was absent or provide a medical certificate if appropriate. Please keep your child at home if they have cold and flu symptoms. If they have allergies, please obtain a letter from your doctor detailing these and keep the office up to date.

Athletics Sports Carnival - Monday 30th May

With the upcoming sports carnival, there is always a sense of pride with house colours. For the new members of the school community, here is what the house colours represent:

St Joseph's is a Josephite school. Mary Mackillop started the Sisters of St Josephs, also known as the Josephite Sisters, named after St Joseph, Jesus' earthly father. To honour Mary Mackillop, we have chosen our House colours based on Mary Mackillop, significant places and people in her life.

RED – MacKillop	As a Josephite School, we Honour Mary Mackillop who started the Sisters of St Joseph and opened the first St Joseph's school in Penola in 1866	
BLUE – Penola	The place where Mary Mackillop and Father Julian Tenison Wood, co-founded the Sisters of St Joseph's in 1866. Mary Mackillop started her mission as a Sister of St Joseph and opened her first St Joseph's school with Father Tennison Woods in his Parish of Penola so that the poor children could get an education	
YELLOW - Tenison	Father Julian Tenison Wood helped Mary Mackillop start the Sisters of St Josephs and worked with her to open the school in Penola for the poor children	
GREEN – Fitzroy	This is the place in Melbourne where Mary Mackillop was born in 1842

Wellbeing Update





As adults, we are constantly managing our level of energy and emotions to achieve our goals from situation to situation. If we are more overt with our children about how we are doing this, they can learn from us in the natural environment. Instead of just walking out of the room when we are upset, we can say, "I'm in the Red Zone and feeling upset right now; I'm going to take a break to calm myself down." We can also help them by co-regulating, which means that we stay calm and help them manage their feelings and adapt their behaviour when needed. We can do this in many ways, such as using a calm tone of voice, getting down to their level, reducing the number of words we use, and also by validating and naming their feelings, such as, "I can see that you are upset; I understand and I'm here for you."

How I feel In the The Red Zone








The *Red Zone* is the highest state of alertness or energy, such as panicked, ecstatic, or devastated. These are often the most intense feelings of energy and may include when we are in a state of fight, flight, freeze, or faint.

Wonder Recycling Rewards for Schools - Please Save Up all Your Bread Bags (And Tags) Over Terms 2 and 3, we will be collecting clean, used bread bags as a part of the Wonder White Bread Recycling Program.

<u>What you need to do:</u> from now until the end of Term 3, please collect all your family's bread bags. Please note they DO NOT have to be Wonder White bags, you can include any brand bread bag. As long as it has had a type of bread in it, it qualifies (burger buns, Lebanese bread, English muffins etc). Please shake all crumbs out and please make sure they are clean and dry.

The most exciting thing about this whole program is that we are saving plastic from going into landfill and we are also giving it an opportunity for it to be repurposed into playground equipment, fencing, decking, park benches and so much more!!

Please start collecting your bread bags and bring them in Term 2. Your child will be able to place them in the Bread Bag Bins that are located around the school – in the new Library, outside Year 4 and the Office.
