Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

We had our Opening and Blessing event last Thursday that I'm sure your children have told you about. Perhaps it was a little early to open and bless, considering that we are still finishing the work on the admin building, staffroom and finishing the landscaping at the back of the school. However, we had lined up Bishop Vincent, Minister for Education, CEDP Director, Mr Greg Whitby and many other guests who would not otherwise be able to make a space in their diary. Unfortunately, as is the way of the world now - Bishop Vincent caught COVID, Minister was involved in flood relief, and many other guests were unwell.



Bishop Vincent was represented by Fr Chris de Souza who many of the teachers and myself know well.

Fr Chris assured us that the Bishop had a mild reaction to COVID. Sarah Mitchell, the Minister for Education was represented by Kevin Connolly our Local Member for Riverstone who is a great friend and supporter of our school. The new Principal of St John Paul II College, Mrs Angela Hay was a special guest as well.

Mr Whitby was an important part of ceremony. Without his leadership we would not have our amazing new school

The children excelled themselves, as I knew they would. Bentley Gray, a student from Year 4, slid down the slippery dip, starting the children singing our school song with special help from Joey (our School Mascot), the Percussionists from our school band and the School Choir.



As part of the ceremony, I spoke about the history and future of our school. It is reproduced below.

Building on Foundations

Our school was created over 20 years ago on strong foundations by the Sisters of St Joseph. Sr Marea Ross, the first Principal, planned well for community, with the motto: "Together We Can".

A connection to the environment that can be seen in the gum leaves and blue mountains on our School Crest and a firm connection to social justice through the words of Micah

"Live justly, love tenderly and walk humbly with your God"

Even though most of the original school has now vanished in the new buildings. These founding principles remain:

▶ Building Community

The curves of the architecture and the furniture, breakout spaces within the classroom builds connection and community- so important in a new community such as Schofields. (Over the course of this year we will have many community events that will involve parents too.)

▶ Connection to the environment

We have beautiful gardens that encourage the children play together with friends and learn actively.

Justice and Faith

The words of Micah are written on the new building, a part of our staff prayer and actions from the children.

The future

Of course, our school is not the same school as when it was first built. It's so exciting to see what amazing learning the teachers create in the spaces, using the possibilities of the architecture. When the school moved into the spaces there was a collective sigh of happiness across the school. Children had spaces to go to that helped their learning but also their welfare. When it was wet weather and hot weather, they had a chance to move. There were quiet places for the children, noisy places, creative places, places where they could easily find a friend, playgrounds where the inside learning doesn't end.

Who knows what the future will hold for St Joseph's? We know it will be a bright future. It's even in our school prayer:

Important Information

COVID Guidelines for Term 3

We currently have 6 active cases of COVID across the school and many more cases of Flu, RSV and just regular coughs and congestion.

Morning Drop off and Afternoon Pick up Reminder

As we return for Term 3, just a reminder of the school's drop off and pick up methods:









Morning:

- 1. Bus Bay Drop-off:
 - a. Enter from the LEFT and there is NO RIGHT TURN in to or out of the Bus Bay;
 - b. Left turn only out of bus bay.
- 2. Nazarene Crescent Kiss & Drop:
 - a. Enter via Jerralong Drive, onto Flynn Street then onto Nazarene Crescent;
 - b. Drop off ONLY.

Afternoon:

Any changes to your child's pick up needs to be called through to the Office by 2pm.

- 1. Parent Pick up: Park in surrounding streets and walk up via the footpath to the school gate via Alex Avenue;
- 2. Rolling Pick-up: Display your number clearly. Enter via Jerralong Drive, right onto Flynn Street, right into Nazarene Cres and patiently wait for the cars to clear;
- 3. Bus: Children are supervised by the Assistant Principal to ensure they get on the right bus;
- 4. Walkers: Children are walked to the crossing where the Crossing Supervior ensures the safe crossing of Alex Avenue;
- 5. COSHC: Please notify COSHC if your child WILL NOT be attending on their scheduled day.

UNSW COMPETITIONS

ATTENDANCE - EVERY DAY and MOMENT OF LEARNING COUNTS

Please ensure that your child not only attends school each day but that they arrive at school on time. Arriving at school on time is just as important as being at school. *Every minute at school counts*. When your child is late to school, they miss valuable start of the day procedures and learning that sets them up for a successful day. *Remember school starts at 8.30am*. If your child arrives after 8.30am you will need to park the car and walk your child to the office as there will be no teacher to assist at the Kiss and Drop area or Nazarene Crescent gate.










Fr Chris blessing our buildings and students.

The **Green Zone** is used to describe a calm state of alertness. When we are in the green zone students are often described as happy, focused, content, curious and engaged learners.




